

Remove Friable Asbestos (A Class)

UNIT STANDARDS: 29766

Outline

This course provides practical knowledge and techniques for the removal of A Class friable asbestos and asbestos-containing materials. The unit includes preparing, enclosing and removing friable ACM, and includes knowledge of decontamination and disposal requirements.

Participants of this course gain NZQA Unit Standard 29766 upon successful completion. This course also covers the ARCP, SWMS Safe Working Method Statements (JSA) and other health and safety risks associated with asbestos removal.

This training is delivered by Fibresafe, an NZQA approved sub-contractor of +IMPAC. The trainers at FibreSafe NZ are independent expert licensed asbestos assessors and provide IANZ accredited laboratory services and asbestos management consultancy. They were the first company in New Zealand to attain IANZ accreditation for asbestos sampling and the surveying of buildings.

-  Builders, Plumbers, Electricians and any other applicable construction trades.
-  Demolition workers.

Prerequisites

-  SiteSafe (NZ) Foundation Passport – Building Construction, or other similar proprietary health and safety induction certification recognised in New Zealand.

-  The documentation required to carry out A Class Asbestos Removal, including Asbestos Removal Control Plans (ARCP), Safe Work Method Statements (SWMS), Job Safety Analysis (JSA) and other health and safety risks associated with asbestos removal.
-  The skills required to prepare the work site and work area for the removal of asbestos.
-  The decontamination process.
-  The requirements of asbestos enclosures specifically for A Class work.
-  How to contribute to and use documentation in line with New Zealand regulatory requirements.
